Eat Safe

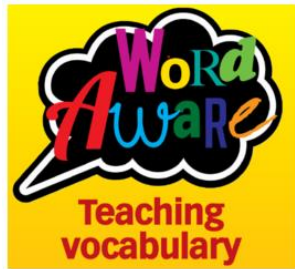
