<u> Times Tables – Mr Belsey</u>

As we are now just over halfway through this academic year, I wanted to write to remind you of the national times tables expectations by the end of each Key Stage which were communicated back in September. These are as follows:

End of Key Stage 1 (Years 1 and 2) - all 2s, 5s and 10s must be confidently known.

End of Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3 and 4) - all times tables to 12x12 must be confidently known.

End of Upper Key Stage 2 (Years 5 and 6) - all times tables to 12x12, including division facts, must be confidently known with quick recall.

We continue to drive the learning of times tables in school across both Key Stages with weekly testing and/or practice and it being an ongoing homework expectation in all year groups from Year 2 upwards. If your child is not practicing their times tables regularly and does not know them to the required level, this impacts on their ability to confidently access the Maths Curriculum.

If you have any questions or would like any additional resources to support in your child's learning of their times tables, please speak to their class teacher who will be able to provide this. Your support in ensuring that these are learnt and practiced regularly is valued and appreciated.
